



What an exciting event, lets celebrate together at Farmfair International in November 2023!

End of July, the Association held a very successful Annual General Meeting in Edmonton. Good discussions took place and members gave the Board of Directors direction on different topics.

Each TSU sample will need to be sent to the lab with a DNA application that can be requested from the office. Registry: The herd letter for 2023 is "L"

Lab Testing: SAC would like to remind its members to allow a one-month turnaround time for all lab test results to ensure your animals can be registered in time for your shows and sales. This is providing there is no issues during testing.

Fall Data Collection: As you wean calves, please remember that it is very important to report on all calves in a contemporary group, in order to give fair credit to all calves (particularly the best ones). As well, weaning is an excellent time to consider collecting docility scores on calves, and weights and body condition scores on cows. The weight and body condition can also assist in planning for winter feeding programs given the high price of feed.

**Membership Information:** Please ensure your membership information is current by calling our office. This includes your address, phone number, and email address.

E-Transfers: The SAC accepts e-transfers. Use "Salers Association of Canada" for recipient and email address info@salerscanada.com. Include SAC account number and security answer on e-transfer message to ensure we can accept it and deposit funds to the correct account.

### THE START OF 50 YEARS OF SALERS IN CANADA

As Salers breeders celebrate a half century of the cattle in Canada, it's a good time to reflect on how it all began, and some of the people who were leaders in building a legacy.

The early 1970's were heady days for 'exotic' cattle in Canada, with imports of many breeds expanding the range of cattle character in the country. The first Salers bull exported from France to North America was Vaillant, standing at the Rimouski, Quebec Al unit where Adrian Demoustier had brought him. As the Salers Report of 1975 indicates, the Quebec firm that imported the bull sent J.J. (Bud) Prosser in 1971 to study the French beef industry in search of an ideal bull for cross breeding with Canadian stock. The number one selection priority was the ability to sire calves that give the least possible amount of calving difficulties. The breed Prosser selected was Salers, which were dual-purpose dairy and beef cattle from the mountainous area of Salers, France, known for their hardiness.

One of those in the middle of the exotic cattle boom was Rudy Enzmann, an auctioneer and sale manager who was impressed with Vaillant. He was quick to line up some Calgary business people to form a syndicate to purchase the bull, including Ten Star

in Calgary in 1973. By 1974, Enzmann and his Relco firm had managed three Salers sales in Alberta, selling 79 half blood open heifer calves, averaging just under \$3000 each, which was claimed to be a Canadian breed record for open half blood heifers that year.

Meantime, the Salers Association of Canada was formed in 1973, with Ron Liesemer as the group's first president. John Moore, with his legal expertise, drafted the bylaws of the organization. Dale Boulton became the first executive secretary in 1974, working out of an office in the Calgary Stockyards. It was an important move to start a Salers registry and track bloodlines. Beginning with the full blood Vaillant bull, there were 212 Vaillant calves, registered as half bloods, and thus the process of adding Salers blood and building up the percentages began. Vaillant went on to have 2265 progeny in the Salers registry. Two more bulls were brought in from France shortly afterwards - Imperial imported by the Pincher Creek Ranch, and Ivanohe by Phil Tetrault; and semen sales were soon booming.

By 1975, the Association held its second annual sale, a high-profile event complete with cattle actually inside the Calgary Inn Ballroom. An imported fullblood bull, Big Jim, from Temp Management of

Calgary and Billings sold to Stuart Robertson and Turner Valley Ranch for \$100,000. They also purchased the high selling female, an imported full blood, for \$60,500. Excitement was building about the potential for this next exotic to make a mark on the livestock industry in Canada.

A key piece of the breed's growth came from a 1975 trip for Canadian breeders and two press people -Harold Dodd of 'Canadian Cattleman' and Randy Mader of 'Focus on Beef' to Salers, France. Boulton organized the trip with Antoine Bonal, Executive Secretary of the French Herd Book for Salers, and French cattle promoter Jean Beaurenault. Seeing the animals in their natural environment and at the largest Salers show in the world served to make many in the group even more committed to building the breed in Canada, plus the press stories helped create awareness in the livestock industry about Salers.

" The cattle came down to the show in the morning, and you could hear their cow bells ringing as they trailed them in," recalled Boulton."

The trip was followed by a significant importation of cattle, with 83 Salers from France entering Canada in 1976. Importing live cattle from Europe was not for the faint of heart or pocketbook. The animals had to be guarantined in France before being shipped to Canada, where they had to spend another three months in quarantine at the St. Pierre & Miquelon Island (a French territory) before heading to their new homes, where they could have contact with no other cattle for another three months.

The Ten Star breeder group active in the formative years included the likes of Eric Proppe, Jim Haldane and Phil Tetrault. Their enthusiasm for the breed (and Tetrault's great marketing abilities) soon attracted others to these cattle. Others like Joe Drisdale, Dale Boulton and Ray Depalme. The trio of early Salers players recently got together to reminisce about some of those early days and people.

Drisdale was a businessman in the catering industry. Naturally he knew restaurateur Phil Tetrault, of the famous Phil's Steak and Pancake House. Drisdales' wife Eleanore, was raised on a farm and loved cattle. So they became early investors in Salers cattle for their place at Okotoks, and prominent breeders with Drisdale's Hidden Valley Ranch. Drisdale bought some local percentage cows, but then imported some full blood cows and a bull from France called Lascar. Another bull that established his presence in the breed was Major.

Dale Boulton worked for Charolais breeder Sam Hector, who was Enzmann's neighbor. There he helped calve out 800 head of seven different breeds, and the idea of an easy calving, low maintenance type of cattle really appealed to him. When he was offered the opportunity to manage the new association, he jumped at it. Boulton was involved in helping Jim Hall of Montana set up the American Salers Association too. After three years of watching others cash in on Salers cattle, Boulton and his wife Lorraine decided to launch their own herd, so he left the office, and Alex McTaggart became his successor. Boulton's started Saddle Mountain Salers in partnership with Eric Proppe, raising Salers based cattle until recent health challenges forced him to slow down.




















Ray Depalme fed out some feedlot cattle on the Red Deer farm with his father, but when his wife Doreen's uncle Jim Haldane told him about Salers, he was intrigued. One meeting with Phil Tetrault (plus the look of the cattle) was enough to convince him the time to act was now. He was able to get a group of 20 half blood heifers from Norman Lee of Lundbreck, to help him launch into the breed full force, aided by the eventual importation of the bull Louis XIV. He was involved in leadership of Salers organizations in various capacities over the years, and remains an active breeder, with his son Travis, and their Sky West Salers.

While Depalme, Boulton and Drisdale agreed every full blood import was slightly different, each made their mark on the Canadian Salers, leaving some form of the distinct cherry red color with the white tail switch. More importantly, they passed on the good udders, feet, calf vigor and calving ease, and fast growth.

There were other significant breed builders of the early years, like Stuart Robertson, Dick Kimmell, and Fred Foxwell, to name just a few. It was Gerry Dixon who started the publication 'Salers - The Balanced Breed' in 1976, which became Salers Country as McTaggert took on being editor.



Breed shows were in their heyday and served as a great venue for breeders to promote their bloodlines as well as Salers cattle. Bull test station feeding trials at Ellerslie and Montana were another marketing tool, especially to commercial buyers.



But it's hard to underestimate the marketing push for Salers from Tetrault.


"Phil was gung-ho and he had plans," recalled Depalme.


Tetrault would share several pages of marketing philosophy in the publications, and one article said "He wants to see the Salers breed achieve what he believes is their well deserved, immense promise as a major cattle breed in North America." To achieve that he had a feasibility study, and a complete marketing plan to prove the Salers female a superior mother, and to bring buyers and sellers of progeny together. Such a focus brought business people and cattle people to the Salers breed, who may never have met any other way.


"He was a good promoter," agreed Drisdale The vision of those first folks to get behind Salers cattle enabled the breed to earn its stripes in the Canadian cattle industry, and a statement from early marketing materials holds just as true today for 'the Balanced Breed': "We think the combination of a calf per cow per year and a uniform calf crop from birth to market makes dollars, as well as sense."

The memories of those times are treasured, especially by Depalme, Boulton and Drisdale.

"It never leaves you. Those were good years," summed up Drisdale.







### SALERS 2023 50 E ANNIVERSAIRE - AU DÉBUT

Alors que les éleveurs de Salers célèbrent un demi-siècle depuis l'arrivée de la race au Canada, c'est le bon moment pour réfléchir à la façon dont tout a commencé et aux certaines personnes qui ont été des chefs de file dans la construction d'un héritage.

Le début des années 1970 a été une période grisante pour les bovins « exotiques » au Canada, les importations de nombreuses races élargissant l'éventail des caractéristiques bovines au pays. Le premier taureau Salers exporté de France en Amérique du Nord était Vaillant, demeurant au centre d'insémination de Rimouski, au Québec, où Adrian Demoustier l'avait amené. Comme l'indique le rapport Salers de 1975, l'entreprise québécoise qui a importé le taureau a envoyé J.J. (Bud) Prosser en 1971 étudier l'industrie bovine française à la recherche d'un taureau idéal pour le croisement avec le bétail canadien. La priorité numéro un était la capacité d'engendrer des veaux qui présentent le moins de difficultés de vêlage possible. La race sélectionnée par Prosser était Salers, qui étaient des bovins laitiers et de boucherie à double usage de la région montagneuse de Salers, en France, connus pour leur rusticité.

L'un de ceux qui étaient au milieu du boom du bétail exotique était Rudy Enzmann, un encanteur et directeur de vente qui a été impressionné par

Vaillant. Il n'hésita pas à convaincre quelques gens d'affaires de Calgary de former un syndicat pour acheter le taureau, notamment Ten Star Breeders, Marquis Properties et Relco Livestock Consultants. Vaillant a été expédié à sa nouvelle résidence à Calgary en 1973. En 1974, Enzmann et son entreprise Relco avaient géré trois ventes Salers en Alberta, vendant 79 génisses ouvertes demi-sang, d'une valeur moyenne d'un peu moins de 3 000 \$ chacune, ce qui était considéré comme un record de race canadien pour les génisses de demi-sang ouvertes cette année-là.

Entre-temps, l'Association Salers du Canada a été formée en 1973, avec Ron Liesemer comme premier président du groupe. John Moore, fort de son expertise juridique, rédigea les règlements administratifs de l'organisation. Dale Boulton est devenu le premier secrétaire exécutif en 1974, travaillant dans un bureau situé le Calgary Stockyards, au centre-ville. C'était une étape importante de créer un registre Salers et de suivre les lignées. En commençant par le taureau fullblood Vaillant qui avait 212 veaux enregistrés comme demi-sang, et ainsi le processus d'addition de génétiques Salers et d'accumulation des pourcentages a commencé. Vaillant a ensuite eu 2265 descendants dans le registre de Salers. Deux autres taureaux ont été amenés de France peu de temps après - Imperial importé par le Pincher Creek Ranch et Ivanohe par Phil Tetrault; et

les ventes de semence ont rapidement explosées.

En 1975, l'Association a tenu sa deuxième vente annuelle, un événement très médiatisé avec du bétail à l'intérieur de la salle de bal du Calgary Inn. Un taureau importé, Big Jim, de Temp Management de Calgary et Billings, a été vendu à Stuart Robertson et au Turner Valley Ranch pour 100 000 \$. Ils ont également acheté la femelle qui a dominée de la vente, une fullblood importée, pour 60 500 \$. L'enthousiasme grandissait quant à la possibilité que ce prochain exotique fasse sa marque dans l'industrie de l'élevage au Canada.

Un élément clé de la croissance de la race est venu d'un voyage en 1975 pour les éleveurs canadiens et deux journalistes - Harold Dodd de 'Canadian Cattleman' et Randy Mader de 'Focus on Beef' à Salers, en France. Boulton a organisé le voyage avec Antoine Bonal, secrétaire exécutif du livre généalogique français de Salers, et le promoteur de bétail français Jean Beaurenault. Voir les animaux dans leur environnement naturel et à la plus grande exposition Salers au monde a permis à de nombreux membres du groupe de s'engager encore plus dans la construction de la race au Canada, et les articles de presse ont contribué à sensibiliser l'industrie de l'élevage à Salers.

« Le bétail est descendu vers le lieu de l'exposition le matin, et on pouvait entendre leur scloches de cousonner alors qu'ils s'approchaient », se souvient Boulton.

Le voyage a été suivi d'une importante importation de bovins, 83 Salers de France étant entrés au Canada en 1976. L'importation de bovins vivants d'Europe n'était pas pour les âmes sensibles ou le portefeuille. Les animaux ont dû être mis en quarantaine

a en France avant d'être expédiés au Canada, où ils ont dû passer encore trois mois en quarantaine à l'île Saint-Pierre-et-Miguelon (territoire français) avant de se diriger vers leurs nouveaux chez-eux, où ils n'ont pu avoir aucun contact avec d'autres bovins pendant trois mois supplémentaires.

Le groupe d'éleveurs Ten Star actif dans les années de formation comprenait Eric Proppe, Jim Haldane et Phil Tetrault. Leur enthousiasme pour la race (et les grandes capacités de marketing de Tetrault) n'ont pas tardé à en attirer d'autres vers ces bovins. D'autres comme Joe Drisdale, Dale Boulton et Ray Depalme. Le trio des premiers joueurs de Salers s'est récemment réuni pour se remémorer certains de ces premiers jours et personnes.

Drisdale était un homme d'affaires dans l'industrie de la restauration. Naturellement, il connaissait le restaurateur Phil Tetrault, du célèbre Phil's Steak and Pancake House. L'épouse de Drisdale, Eleanore, a été élevée sur une ferme et aimait le bétail. Ils devinrent donc les premiers investisseurs dans le bétail Salers pour leur propriété à Okotoks, et des éleveurs de premier plan avec leur ranch Drisdale's Hidden Valley Ranch. Drisdale a acheté quelques vaches pourcentages localement, mais a ensuite importé des fullbloods et un taureau de France appelé Lascar. Un autre taureau qui a établi sa présence dans la race était Major.

Dale Boulton travaillait pour l'éleveur Charolais Sam Hector, qui était le voisin d'Enzmann. Là, il a aidé à vêler 800 têtes de sept races différentes, et l'idée d'un type de bétail facile à vêler et nécessitant peu d'entretien l'a vraiment séduit. Lorsqu'on lui a offert l'opportunité de gérer la nouvelle association, il a sauté sur l'occasion. Boulton a également aidé Jim

Hall du Montana à mettre sur pied l'American Salers Association. Mais après trois ans à regarder les autres tirer profit du bétail Salers, Boulton et sa conjointe Lorraine ont décidé de lancer leur propre troupeau, alors il a quitté le bureau, et Alex McTaggart est devenu son successeur. Boulton a lancé Saddle Mountain Salers en partenariat avec Eric Proppe, élevant du bétail à base de Salers jusqu'à ce que de récents problèmes de santé l'obligent à ralentir et à les laisser partir.

Ray Depalme était engraisseurs de bovins sur sa ferme de Red Deer avec son père, mais lorsque l'oncle de son épouse Doreen, Jim Haldane, lui parle de Salers, il est intrigué. Une rencontre avec Phil Tétrault (plus une inspection du bétail) a suffi à le convaincre que le moment était venu d'agir. Il a pu obtenir un groupe de 20 génisses demi-sang de Norman Lee de Lundbreck, pour l'aider à se lancer pleinement dans la race, aidé par l'importation éventuelle du taureau Louis XIV. Il a été impliqué dans la direction des organisations Salers à divers titres au fil des ans, et reste un éleveur actif, avec son fils Travis et leur entreprise Sky West Salers.

Bien que Depalme, Boulton et Drisdale aient convenu que chaque importation de fullblood était légèrement différente, chacun a laissé sa marque sur les Salers canadiens, laissant une certaine forme de leur couleur rouge cerise distincte avec les poils de queue blancs. Plus important encore, ils ont transmis des bons pis, les pieds, la vigueur et la facilité de vêlage, ainsi que la croissance rapide.

Il y avait d'autres constructeurs de races importants des premières années, comme Stuart Robertson, Dick Kimmell et Fred Foxwell, pour n'en nommer que quelques-uns. C'est Gerry Dixon qui a lancé la publication « Salers - The Balanced Breed » en 1976, qui est devenue Salers Country lorsque McTaggert a pris la direction de la rédaction.

Les expositions de races étaient à leur apogée et constituaient un excellent lieu pour promouvoir les animaux Salers. Les stations d'épreuve de taureaux à Ellerslie et au Montana étaient un autre outil de marketing, en particulier pour attirer les acheteurs commerciaux.



Mais il est difficile de sous-estimer la poussée marketing de Tetrault pour Salers. « Phil était enthou siaste et il avait des grands projets », se souvient Depalme.

Tetrault partagerait plusieurs pages de philosophie de marketing dans les publications, et un article disait : « Il veut voir la race Salers réaliser ce qu'il croit être leur immense promesse bien méritée en tant que race bovine majeure en Amérique du Nord. » Pour ce faire, il disposait d'une étude de faisabilité et d'un plan de marketing complet pour prouver que la femelle Salers était une mère supérieure et pour réunir les acheteurs et les vendeurs de progéniture. Une telle focalisation a amené les hommes d'affaires et les éleveurs de bétail à la race Salers, qui ne se sont peut-être jamais rencontrés autrement.

Il était un bon promoteur », a convenu Drisdale.

La vision de ces premières personnes à soutenir le bétail Salers a permis à la race de gagner ses galons dans l'industrie bovine canadienne, et une déclaration tirée des premiers documents de commercialisation est tout aussi vraie aujourd'hui pour « la race équilibrée » : « Nous pensons que la combinaison d'un veau par vache et par an et d'une récolte uniforme de veaux de la naissance au marché rapporte de l'argent. ainsi que du sens.

Les souvenirs de cette époque sont précieux, en particulier par Depalme, Boulton et Drisdale.

« Il ne vous quitte jamais. Ce furent de bonnes années », résume Drisdale.

- c. Must exhibit at Farmfair



### **MITCH JONES**

It is with broken hearts and deep sorrow that we share the sad news of the sudden passing of our beloved Mitch Jones, on May 16, 2023, at age 63. Mitch was a loving father and husband who was completely devoted with unconditional love to this family.

Mitch was born in Sydney, Australia in 1960 and called Palm Beach, north Sydney his home. Living on the ocean, Mitch was a swimmer, surfer and absolutely loved sailing. Mitch's mother was a figure skating coach and his father loved hockey so at a very young age, Mitch learned how to skate.

Being a powerful skater in a man's body at only age 14, he drew the attention of a Canadian hockey scout who encouraged the family to get Mitch to Canada to play hockey. After 2 years of paperwork to get into Canada, the family arrived in Calgary in 1976, and although he was unknown in the Canadian hockey circles upon arrival, he quickly found himself playing for the Regina Pats in the Western Hockey League. It was also while in Regina, that Mitch became interested in purebred cattle and agriculture when the Regina Pat's ice arena transformed into Saskatchewan's Canadian Western Agribition for 10 days in November. And coincidentally, Regina would also be the place that he started dating his future wife Leah, several years later.



When Mitch wrapped up his hockey career, he and his brother Scott formed Braidwood Stock Farm successfully raising, showing and selling Salers cattle across the globe. Some said it was sinful what Mitch could do with a pair of clippers as he could clip toplines on cattle unlike anyone else. And it was through Salers cattle and the show ring that he first met Leah. In fact, Leah and her father flew down to their first Salers sale in High River and purchased several females including a famous cow called Kokomo. Mitch often teased Leah that he married her just to get Kokomo back!

Mitch and Leah were married in Westlock on May 27, 1995, combining their cow herds of purebred Salers and purebred Simmentals along with some Black Angus cattle. In 1997 their daughter Haylea was born, followed by Kayla in 1998 and Jett in 2002. Mitch was so, so proud of his three children and followed them to all of their events including cattle shows, figure skating, singing and Jett's hockey, most recently as captain of the Lethbridge Hurricanes in the Western Hockey League. And all of them have been committed to the Calgary Stampede including Mitch as a dedicated Barn Boss for the past ten years. Haylea, Kayla and Jett will continue his legacy at the Stampede.

Mitch will be remembered by his loving wife Leah, his three children Haylea Thorogood (Evan), Kayla Jones and Jett Jones, along with his mother Patsy Ann Jones, and brothers Scott Jones, Luke Jones and Yancy Jones as well as many extended family and friends. Mitch was predeceased by his grandparents and father Jimmy Jones.

Mitch made a lasting impact on all of those lucky enough to have known him. We often teased him that he neither had an Australian accent or a Canadian accent, rather something created in between.

And so starts his next journey. His absence will be felt deeply, and his love of family and passion for cattle will forever be remembered. You will be missed big guy. May your soul rest in eternal peace.




